Prespatou Elementary Secondary School partners with the CWB Foundation to upgrade the equipment in the metal shop.

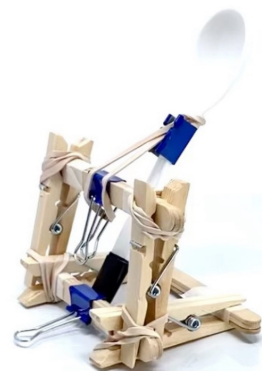
