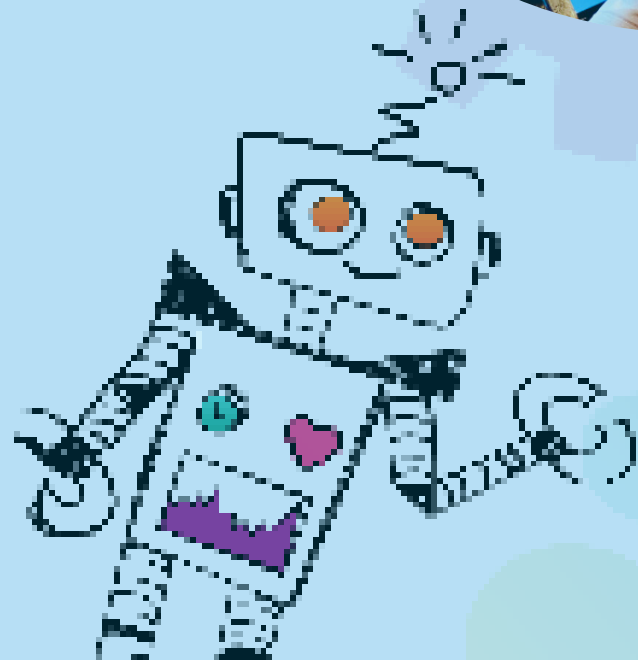

Are You Ready For College?

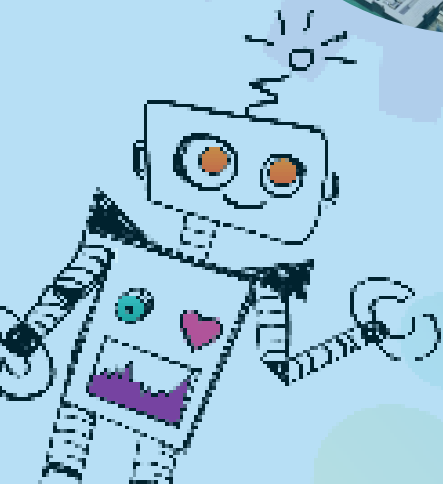
